The Planning and Zoning Department is responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the Jefferson County Comprehensive Plan and the Jefferson County Agricultural Preservation and Land Use Plan. Ordinances which have been adopted relating to these plans include the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance, the Private Sewage System Ordinance, the Floodplain Ordinance, the Shoreland/Wetland Ordinance, and the Land Division/Subdivision Ordinance.

The department also runs the solid waste/ clean sweep program for the County and the Wisconsin Fund Program. This workload is administered by a staff of six and overseen by the Zoning Committee, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors, the Board of Adjustment, Corporation Counsel, Solid Waste Committee, County Administrator, and multiple federal and state agencies.

This department functions under the direction of the Director of Planning and Zoning, who is appointed by the County Administrator. Policy guidance is provided by the County Board's Planning and Zoning Committee.

Two thousand fifteen was another interesting year for the Planning and Zoning Department. The prolonged economic slump which began in 2007 has stabilized and appears to be improving slowly. New home construction and related permitting has been on the increase this year which has had a positive effect on our revenues and budget. The Department issued 495 zoning permits for the year, compared to 477 in 2014. Of those, 76 were for new homes which compares with 54 in 2014, 67 in 2013, 57 in 2012, 52 in 2011, 66 in 2010, 85 in 2009, 102 in 2008, and 150 in 2007. Revenue numbers for the first half of 2016 indicate a slight increase over 2015 realized revenues. We are hopeful this trend continues.

The flood of 2008 continued to have an impact on our department workload as we reviewed and issued 20 floodplain related permits. The Jefferson County Board adopted the new FIRM Maps (Flood Insurance Rate Maps) effective as of February 4, 2015, as well as the updated floodplain model ordinance which now includes flood storage, as required by DNR and FEMA to remain compliant with the National Flood Insurance Program. This new study and associated maps are available to view on the County webpage, and for purchase at the FEMA.GOV website. Continued enforcement of floodplain regulations keeps Jefferson County and its residents eligible for flood insurance, federally backed mortgages, and disaster assistance from the federal government.

Revisions to NR115 Wisconsin Administrative Code which relates to state mandated shoreland/wetland regulations that the county enforces has continued to see changes by the legislature. We have finished our revision as required by state law in early 2016, but due to more changes in Madison, our work will continue. Other text amendments on the horizon include a Wind Energy Systems Ordinance, revisions to the recently adopted Shoreland/Wetland Ordinance, update to the Sign Ordinance due to action by the Supreme Court, and updates to our Land Division/Subdivision Ordinance and Private Sewage System Ordinance.

The Jefferson County Planning and Zoning Department with the Planning and Zoning Committee continues its implementation of the Comprehensive Plan and Jefferson County Agricultural Preservation and Land Use Plan approved by DATCP and adopted by County Board in 2012, in its daily work as well as in the Zoning Committee's decision making process and recommendations to County Board. From 2000 through 2015 under the Agricultural Preservation and Land Use Plan, 39,724 acres have been preserved from further A-3 Rural Residential lot development, allowing 1,062 lots to be created, covering 2,143 acres, at an average lot size of 2.10 acres each. In 2015, 53 A-3 lots were approved covering 114 acres, at an average lot size of 2.10 acres. With its participation in the State's farmland preservation program, landowners remain eligible for a tax credit under Chapter 91 of the Wisconsin State Statutes. For 2015 (2014 tax year), Jefferson County had 619 claimants receiving \$730,929 and covering 98,214 acres of land, as reported by the Department of Revenue.

Zoning Department staff handled 96 new violations, updated 138 violations, and closed 73 violations. This process takes a lot of staff time and also involves a great deal of time and energy from the Corporation Counsel's office. Thank you Blair and Connie for all the help and assistance in these matters.

Our Department also regulates and inspects the installation of all new and replacement septic systems known as POWTS- Private on-site waste treatment systems throughout the County. 2015 saw a total of 104 new and replacement POWTS. This shows a general increase in numbers over the last several years, but significantly lower

than 2007 levels when the department experienced 168 new and replacement POWTS. Our inspector also inspects soil boring for new and replacement systems to help determine the location, type, and size of POWTS required for a specific parcel and use proposed. In 2015, 132 soil test reviews were conducted, reviewed and filed. The department also continues to administer the Wisconsin Fund which is a grant program that provides some funding for the rehabilitation of failing POWTS based on certain income levels. However, due to state cuts in the program, we have not seen an applicant for the last 2 years.

Department staff has continued to implement the state-mandated POWTS maintenance program that requires all existing POWTS to be pumped and/or inspected every 3 years with a report sent in to the County Zoning Department. A full inventory of all POWTS and the program to track compliance is required to be in place by 2019.

In 2015, Sharon Ehrhardt and the Solid Waste Committee continued their work on providing recycling education and clean sweep events for disposing of hazardous waste, chemicals, e-waste, and prescription drugs for households, farms, and businesses. This program is supported by non-levy tax dollars. Host Fee revenues generated by a negotiated agreement between the Town of Farmington and Jefferson County, paid by the Deer Track Park Landfill, accounted for the majority of the programs operating funds at \$63,490. The City of Watertown also generously donates \$20,000 to the program and has been a great partner. State grant money accounts for another \$25,715 but can vary from year to year. We also receive donations from multiple Towns and Cities and Villages within the County, totaling over \$7,000. E waste recycling payments for 2015 were \$10,211, but due to extreme changes in the commodities markets worldwide, we now get charged for the collection of some e-waste and for 2016, the collection has been changed to a pay for disposal event. For 2015, 1,050,836 million pounds of e-waste were collected, and in the first 6 months of 2016, close to \$100,000 was paid out to recycle the e-waste collected.

In 2015, four clean sweep events were held, accounting for 1,328,667 pounds of household, agricultural, and business waste collected and kept out of the local landfill. Prescription drugs and other pharmaceuticals are now collected at our drug drop off sites around the County. These drug drop off boxes are located at the Sheriff's Department in Jefferson and the Police Departments in Waterloo, Watertown, Lake Mills, Fort Atkinson, Jefferson, Palmyra, Whitewater, and UW-Whitewater.

Special thanks go out to Sheriff Paul Milbrath for his help with the drug collection program, and Rick Schultz with the City of Watertown. Both these gentlemen go above and beyond the call in support of the solid waste program. Also, we have numerous business's, Towns, Villages, and cities that have become partners in the program and financial supporters as well.

Attached you will find a number of reports and lists regarding the Planning and Zoning Department and solid waste program in Jefferson County.

Overall, 2015 presented lots of learning opportunities, challenges, and obstacles for the Planning and Zoning Department staff and Planning and Zoning Committee. Land use regulations are in a constant state of change. We do our best to stay abreast of all developments and react as quickly and positively as we can. I would like to thank the Planning and Zoning Committee, the Solid Waste Committee, and the Zoning Board of Adjustment for all their support and hard work. We look forward to another dynamic year in 2016.






