### Sirens and Warning Systems

- Public siren systems have steady siren tones that last three to five minutes. This warning is used for nuclear releases, tornadoes, chemical spills or other emergencies.
- Emergency vehicles, such as police cars, will sound their sirens while moving at slow speeds.
- Siren testing is done the first Wednesday of each month at approximately Noon. The sirens sound for about one minute.

### What to do When Sirens Sound

- Go indoors.
- Tune to a local Emergency Alerting System (EAS) radio station for instructions as to what you should do. Below is a list of EAS stations:
