

Fair main stage tickets on sale Wednesday

JEFFERSON — Tickets for the 2015 Jefferson County main stage musical performances will go on sale Wednesday at 10 a.m.

This year's musical entertainers at the Wilbert Betschler Memorial Grandstand will be Chris Cagle on Friday, July 10, with opening act Gunnar and the Grizzly Boys.

Rock and Roll Hall of Fame inductee Joan Jett and the Blackhearts are slated to take the stage on Saturday, July 11.

Cagle, known for his redneck, rock-and-roll, has produced two gold albums and fan favorites including, "Let There Be Cowgirls," "Chicks Dig It" and "Got My Country On."

Gunnar and the Grizzly Boys have made a name for themselves with hits such as "Pedal To The Floor" and "Standard American."

On Saturday, Rock and Roll Hall of Fame inductee Joan Jett and the Blackhearts will bring hard-rocking classics to the main stage. Jett has produced eight platinum and gold albums and nine Top 40 singles, and recently was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Grandstand seating for the musical performances is free, but reserved seats and party pit tickets will be available for prices ranging from \$20 to \$35 plus gate admission.

For Cagle's show on Friday, reserve seats are \$20 plus gate admission and party pit passes are \$25 plus admission.

The 163rd Jefferson County Fair will take place July 8-12.

This year's fair theme is "Year of the Cheese" as a tribute to Wisconsin's cheese and dairy industry.

Kids' Day will be Wednesday, July 8, with free gate admission for children age 12 and under until 5 p.m.
