

Four new faces for at least four county board seats

JEFFERSON — All 30 seats on the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors will be on the spring ballot on Tuesday, April 5. At least four of them will be contested and two will have new faces.

The following is a list of contested or open districts, the areas they cover and the candidates. They are:

District 10

Incumbent Supervisor Al Counsell filed noncandidacy papers and will not be seeking re-election in District 10.

Newcomers Mark Groose, Marilyn Buelow and former supervisor Lloyd Zastrow will face off in the Feb. 16 primary to narrow the field to two candidates for the April general election.

District 10 includes Wards 1 and 3 in the Town of Concord, Wards 3 and 4 in the Town of Ixonia.

District 20

Frankie Fuller, a former supervisor, is challenging incumbent Supervisor Jim Mode for his seat on the board in District 20.

The district includes Wards 1, 2 and 3 in the Town of Jefferson and Ward 4 in the Town of Oakland.

District 24

The District 24 seat has been vacant since Callie Edwards resigned from the post in June 2015. Newcomer Matt Klubertanz is seeking to fill the vacant position.

The district includes Wards 11 and 12 in the City of Whitewater.

District 27

Incumbent District 27 Supervisor Glen Borland is being challenged by newcomer Robert Bennett in his bid for re-election.

The district includes Wards 3 and 4 in the City of Fort Atkinson.

District 29

Incumbent Paul Babcock filed noncandidacy papers and will not be seeking re-election in District 29

Newcomer Timothy Smith is vying for the seat uncontested.

District 29 includes Wards 5 and 6 in the City of Fort Atkinson;

District 30

District 30 incumbent Supervisor Walt Christensen is being challenged for his seat by newcomer Gary Kutz.

Wards 4-6 in the Town of Koshkonong and Ward 1 in the Town of Sumner are included in District 30.
