

## Christensen loses re-election bid for county board of supervisors

JEFFERSON — Four of the 30 seats on the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors will be filled with new members in the wake of Tuesday's general election.

Only four county board races were contested, with District 30 Supervisor Walt Christensen losing his bid for a new term.

The following outlines the ballot tallies:

### District 30

Newcomer Gary Kutz unseated incumbent Supervisor Walt Christensen, earning 54 percent of the votes to Christensen's 46 percent.

Kutz received 540 ballots to Christensen's 460,

Wards 4-6 in the Town of Koshkonong and Ward 1 in the Town of Sumner are included in District 30.

### District 10

Former Supervisor Lloyd Zastrow returned to the board in District 10 to take over the seat being vacated by Supervisor Al Counsell. Zastrow picked up 539 votes to newcomer Mark Groose's 472.

District 10 includes Wards 1 and 3 in the Town of Concord, Wards 3 and 4 in the Town of Ixonia.

### District 20

Incumbent Jim Mode was re-elected to his District 20 seat, which represents Wards 1,2 and 3 in the Town of Jefferson and Ward 4 in the Town of Oakland.

He faced challenger Frankie Fuller, who received 317 votes to Mode's 582 ballots.

### District 27

Voters in District 27, which includes Wards 3 and 4 in the City of Fort Atkinson, returned incumbent Glen Borland as their representative on the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors, after a close contest by challenger Robert Bennett.

Borland earned 444 votes in his bid for re-election, with Bennett garnering 407 votes.

## **Unopposed**

### **District 24**

Newcomer Matt Klubertanz received 184 votes in his bid to fill the vacant position in District 24, which includes Wards 11 and 12 in the City of Whitewater.

The seat formerly was held by Callie Edwards, who resigned in June 2015.

### **District 29**

Incumbent Paul Babcock did not seek re-election in District 29

Newcomer Timothy Smith earned 477 votes in his unopposed bid for the seat.

District 29 includes Wards 5 and 6 in the City of Fort Atkinson.
